



Rumpke Residential Recycling Information

Below is the current list of recyclable items for all of Rumpke's recycling programs.

Please call 513-242-4600 with any questions.

Acceptable items include:

- Plastic bottles #1 and #2, no lids
- Glass jars and bottles of any color
- Aluminum, steel and bi-metal cans
- Empty aerosol cans with lids and tips removed
- Brown grocery bags
- Computer paper, and other mixed office paper
- Corrugated cardboard, broken down to 3'x3'
- Envelopes, with or without windows
- Junk mail
- Magazines
- Newspapers with inserts
- Paperboard, such as cereal boxes
- Telephone books

Unacceptable items:

- Plastics #3-7
- Plastics #1 and #2 that are not bottles, such as Cool Whip containers, butter tubs, or food trays
- Plastic bags
- Motor oil jugs or other chemical containers
- Styrofoam
- Lids/caps
- Window or drinking glass
- Light bulbs
- Pizza boxes
- Coat hangers or steel scrap
- Paint cans

Recycling guidelines:

- Please rinse all bottles and jars, and remove the lids. There is no need to remove labels, since they disintegrate in the recycling process.
- Flatten all cans and plastic bottles to conserve space. Please break down cardboard to 3'x3' sections, and flatten all boxes.
- Place all recyclables together in your dumpster. Thanks to Rumpke's single stream processing method, all recyclables are mechanically sorted at the processing facility.
- Set your recycling bin out the night before your regular trash collection day.
- Extra materials can be placed in a brown grocery bag or similar plastic container. Please label it for recycling and set it on top of or next to your Rumpke bin. No trash can should be used for recycling.
- We strive to accept as many items as possible. We cannot collect certain items because of contamination issues or lack of market availability.
- For electronics or household hazardous material recycling, please contact your county's solid waste district.
