## Meeting Highlights

*Math Counts* is a national mathematics contest for Middle and Junior High School Students in grades 6, 7 & 8 designed to sharpen their mathematical skills by competing on teams answering mathematics problems (similar to the *College Bowl*). Teams of 4 students compete at the chapter and state level. At the national level the top 4 individual *mathletes* compete as an all-star team representing Ohio

It is sponsored by the National Society of Professional Engineers (NSPE), the State Professional Engineering Societies, and the local Chapters. Each school sends a team plus backups to compete at the local level; the winners there go to the State level, and if skillful, can compete in the national contest in Washington D. C.

In addition to the contests, students may take written tests to test their skills against their peers. The Cincinnati Chapter, Ohio Society of Professional Engineers, has had over 30 teams from local schools competing every spring in Zimmer Auditorium at the University of Cincinnati. Sycamore Junior High has won six consecutive years, except they were "scooped" by Mason this year.

John Molander has worked for over 25 years at Procter & Gamble. During this time he has held positions as Plant Process Engineer, Engineering Technology Leader, R& D Section Head and presently is the principal engineer/scientist in baby care research and development.

John is a graduate of Cornell University with a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering. He holds a professional engineers license in the state of Ohio. He is a member of the Ohio Society of Professional engineers John has been active in the local and state Math Counts program for almost 10 years.
