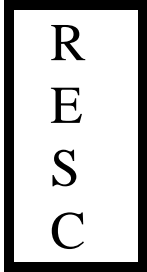

LIVING IN ANTARCTICA

ROY JUMP

Our speaker, Roy Jump had the unique experience of living in Antarctica for a year at the courtesy of the United States Navy. In 1961 the United States still had the military draft for the Armed Services. Mr. Jump did not want to be drafted because you were almost always assigned to the U.S. Army so he joined the U.S. Navy Reserves in September of 1961. He spent time in the reserves until he was called to active duty in March of 1962 where he was sent to Norfolk, Virginia. From Norfolk Roy was sent to the U.S. Navy Station at Davisville, Rhode Island, for training as a Seabee.

In October 1962 Roy was flown to McMurdo Station on Ross Island 20 miles from the Antarctica mainland and some 700 miles from the South Pole. (Continued on pg. 2, Antarctica.)

Roy had two assignments there: (1.) Monitor the fuel oil supply tanks to assure enough fuel oil was available for heat and other purposes, (2.) Maintain and record all base drawing changes which included equipment and outside physical drawings from a surveyor stationed there with Roy.

During the 6 month summer daylight period they worked 8 hours a day, 7 days a week. During winter, the 6 month dark period, they were given a day off and only worked 6 days a week. In the daylight period Roy acquainted himself with the area and took many slides, including Adelie penguins, Skua gulls and seals. He will also talk about landing next to the 200 foot thick ice of the Blue Glacier. He will describe flying in a C130 to a remote weather station 350 miles from the South Pole to pick up 4 men. Due to a landing gear problem on the C130 they were stranded for 10 days. Roy also assisted a scientist looking for bugs, insects, algae etc.

Mr. Jump's presentation promises to be very interesting with pictures and commentary of his experiences at the bottom of the world.

Mr. Jump is a native Cincinnati and currently lives in Finneytown. He worked at Cincinnati Gas and Electric (Cinergy), now Duke Energy until his retirement in 1994.

NORTH ON I-71 TO EXIT#25 (KINGS MILL ROAD). TURN LEFT ON TO KINGS MILL ROAD AND CROSS OVER I-71. GO TO SR 741; MAKE A RIGHT TURN AT KROGER'S (ON RIGHT SIDE). FOLLOW SR 741 TO TRAFFIC LIGHT AT U.S. 42, MAKE A RIGHT HAND TURN. AT THE NEXT INTERSECTION MAKE A RIGHT HAND TURN ON TO MASON-MORROW ROAD. IN LESS THAN 1/4 MILE LOOK FOR THE MASON WATER RECLAMATION PLANT ON THE LEFT SIDE OF THE ROAD, TURN LEFT INTO THE PARKING LOT. PARK NEAR THE FLAGPOLE AND ENTER THE BUILDING.

Directions: Return to I-71 crossing over the expressway and look for Ruby Tuesday's immediately on the right. (See map.)

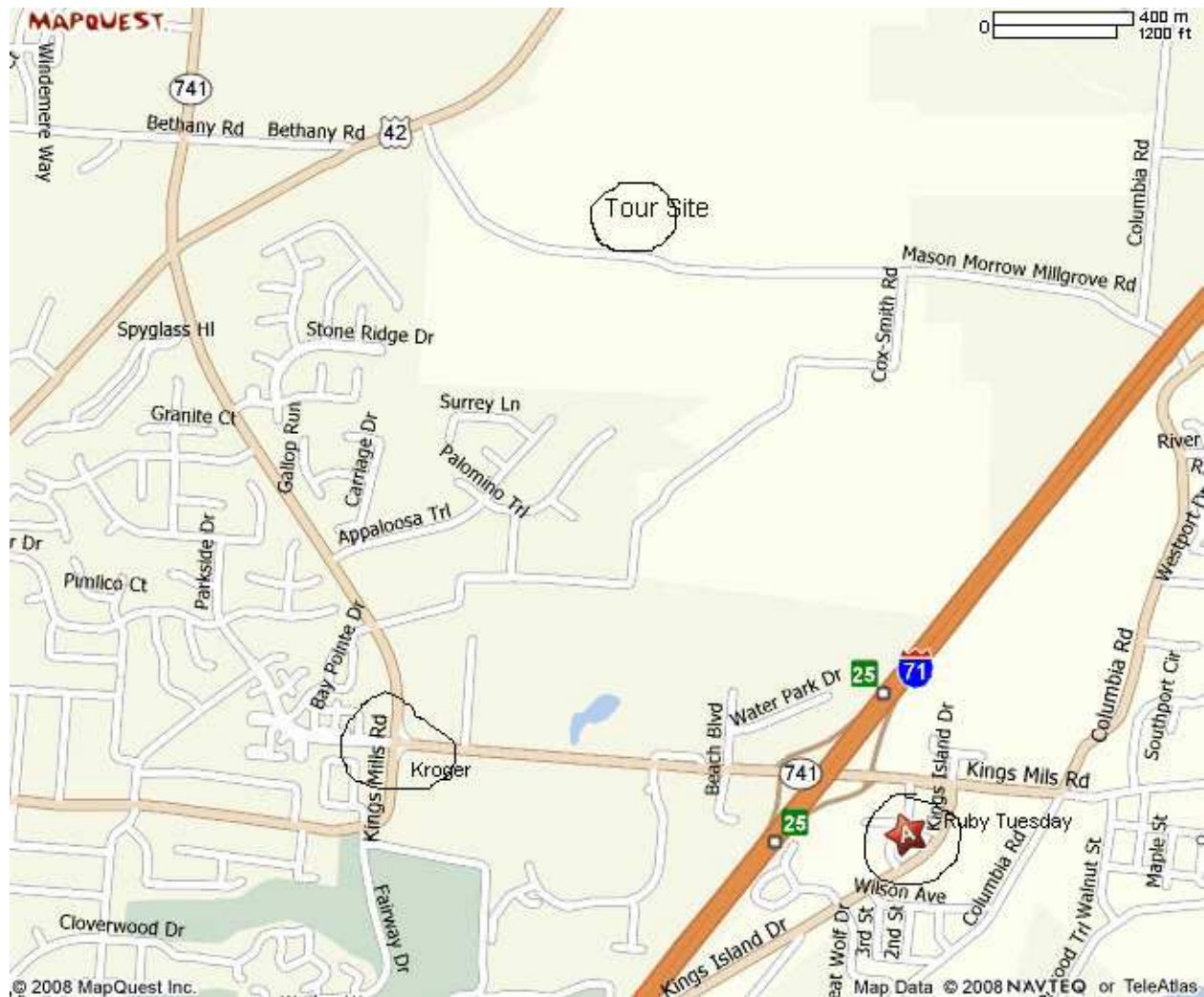
ECONOMIC STIMULUS PAYMENT

THE THOMAS GRIFFIN STORY, “AIR RAID ON TOKYO” IS HUGE SUCCESS

The navigator in B-25 number 9, Thomas Griffin was a member of the daring bomber group “Doolittle’s Raiders” that took off from the USS Hornet to bomb Tokyo just four months after the December 7, 1941 sneak attack on Pearl Harbor by the Japanese.
