Please join us in January for a trip back in time to South America as it was in 1961.

Last spring when Art Kupferle made a presentation regarding his recent trip to South America, Dr. Bereskin was reminded that he had covered much of the same ground in 1961. When he got home that evening he got his slides from the cupboard where they had been boxed in carousels for the past forty years and reexamined them. He was greatly surprised that they were in excellent condition and that there was essentially zero overlap between what Art had shown and what he himself had taken.

Dr. Bereskin's trip on that occasion covered all of the major cities of South America on both the East and West sides of the Andes Mountains and also Mexico City. The slides show Engineering and Topographical subjects and also subjects of General Interest.

We are fortunate to have Dr. Alexander B. Bereskin as an RESC member and as one ready to share his experiences. He has a distinguished career as a practicing engineer, a leading U.C. professor becoming Professor Emeritus in 1983, Professional Engineer consultant in electronics of all types to numerous industries and government, active participant in professional societies, recipient of many honors, and holder of important electronic patents.

We look forward to his presentation of a different look at South America. ◆

CAM History



Founded in 1881, the Cincinnati Art Museum is one of the country's oldest visual arts institutions and the first general art

museum west of the Alleghenies to be established in its own building.

The Cincinnati Art Museum opened to world acclaim in May 1886, heralded as "The Art Palace of the West."

Over the years there have been many additions to CAM. In 1907 the Emma Louise Schmidlapp Wing opened followed by the Ropes Wing in 1910.

In 1930 the Emery, Hanna & French Wings were added.

In 1937 the Alms wing was opened. This addition provided an auditorium and library, as well as gallery and office space.

In the late 1940s and early 1950s there were major changes to the interior of the building prior to future additions.

In 1965 the Adams-Emery Wing opened. This addition greatly expanded the gallery space as well as created the lecture hall and restaurant.

From 1991 to 1993 an extensive two-year, \$13 million renovation restored the grandeur of the Museum's interior along with creating new gallery space. This addition also added improved lighting and climate control.

In May of this year the new Cincinnati Wing was added, providing a 10 million dollar renovation of 18,000 square feet of gallery space. This wing tells the story of art in the Queen City, making it the first museum to dedicate permanent gallery space to a cross-media presentation of a community's art history.

Directions to the Cincinnati Art Museum

From I-71 South

Take the Reading/Gilbert Road Exit (exit no. 2). stay in the Reading Road exit lane, get in the left lane and turn left onto Elsinore, go one block, turn left on Gilbert Avenue. At the next light turn right onto Eden Park Drive. Stay in the right lane to Art Museum Drive.

From I-71/I-75 North (From Kentucky)

As you cross the bridge from KY to OH, get in the right lane and turn right onto I-71 North ("to Columbus" signs); pass the Stadium & Coliseum, go through Lytle Tunnel, then get in the left lane to exit at the Reading Road/Eden Park Drive exit. While exiting move over to the right lane and turn right onto Eden Park Drive. Go straight through the next light across Gilbert Avenue and enter Eden Park. Stay in the right lane to Art Museum Drive.
