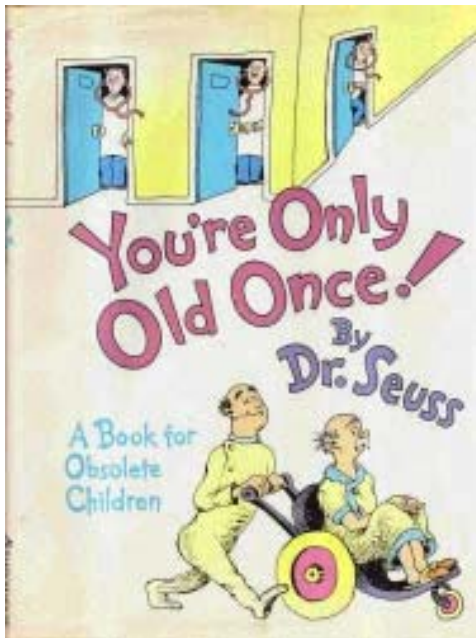
This will be the last meeting of our program year.

Valerie A. Lemmie

Valerie Lemmie Assumed the position of City Manager for the City of Cincinnati in April, 2002. As the City's chief administrative officer, Ms. Lemmie is responsible for 15 City departments, more than 6,000 full time employees, and an operating and capital budget of \$1 Billion.

As City Manager, Ms. Lemmie supervises the implementation of City policy, controls government finances, and provides continuity and support to the Mayor and Members of City Council. Prior to coming to Cincinnati, Ms. Lemmie served as City Manager of Dayton, Ohio and as an adjunct professor in Public Administration at the University of Dayton.

She was recently elected President of the National Academy of Public Administration, a federally chartered think tank that reviews and analyzes public policy issues and provides technical assistance and support to governmental agencies.

Through various departments, Ms. Lemmie is responsible for providing and maintaining essential services for the City. Ms. Lemmie is focused on the efficient and cost-effective operation of the city. Citizens require and depend upon the city for many services, among them are police and fire protection, water, sewage disposal, recreational facilities, parks, public health clinics and trash removal.

A distinguished speaker, Ms. Lemmie has made presentations at many conferences on a wide array of topics, including the environment, business development, leadership, finance citizen participation, law enforcement relations, work force performance and competitive service delivery.

Ms. Lemmie has been highly involved in community service for many years. Her service
