Meeting Highlights



Every Parent's Library

In 1998, Every Parent's Library's founder, Gene Gardner, began a search for a way that would be successful in reaching primary care givers to provide them with high quality, effective parenting information just before they needed it. From his efforts, it became obvious that empowering parents via an extended series of loaned videos, combined with the personal attention of follow-up contact could be a winning concept. This concept was unique, not offered elsewhere in the nation and perhaps the world. Nevertheless, most people recognize the potential significance this service can bring to our community. The leaders of Every Parent's Library are committed to taking the time for a quality approach – recruiting professionals as volunteers in all capacities to build a strong foundation for a successful program.

In November 1999, EPL obtained a mentor for organizational guidance. Soon thereafter, we formed a team of Professional Advisors for program guidance, developed a business plan, and conducted research to obtain answers to key questions and concerns. After hundreds of meetings and energetic support from many individuals and organizations, Every Parent's Library became a not-for-profit organization on October 12, 2001. The first meeting of the Board of Trustees was Dec 15, 2001. During the following year, procedures were developed and a few videotapes obtained. A small-scale proof-of-concept trial was initiated in late 2002 with very positive results.

Please plan to attend this meeting and listen to what Gene has to say about *Every Parent's Library*. If you can spare some time he would welcome your participation as a volunteer in this very worthwhile endeavor.

Note: All spouses are invited and encouraged to attend this program as well. It is a program RESC should embrace and support.

Directions to AWI

From Cincinnati take I 74 West to Dry Fork Road (exit No. 3). Turn right on Dry Fork Road. .65 miles to Enterprise Drive. Turn left on Enterprise Drive .14 miles to AWI on the left. Look for the clock tower in the front of the building.

Directions to Market Street Grille from AWI

Turn right (South) on Dry Fork Road .7 miles to Harrison Avenue. Turn right (West) on Harrison. Travel 1.7 miles on Harrison into old Harrison. Market Street Grille will be on you right at the intersection of Harrison and Walnut Street.

Tour Highlights

AWI is a not-for-profit trade association dedicated to the advancement of horology. Horology is the study of the art and science of time. The Institute provides extensive educational and technical services to its members.

After a brief presentation by Mr. Gary Richards, we will tour their facility and learn all about the future of horology in America. We will see the training facility where classes are given in all phases of Watchmaking and Clockmaking

repair. Like many other skilled trades this industry also needs skilled craftsmen to continue the profession.



We will tour the Henry B. Fried Library which is considered to be one of the finest horological libraries in the world. The collection includes rare volumes and unpublished research materials which are invaluable to the study of time.

We will finish up the tour by visiting the Orville R. Hagans Museum. It is truly a study of time and includes many early time keeping devices as well as priceless timepieces acquired or donated to the museum.



We will be limited to 20 attendees at this meeting. If there is sufficient interest we will schedule a second tour on December 2.
