Meeting Highlights



Please join us in October for an educational and entertaining presentation. Take a trip back through the history of Cincinnati Railroads, back to the age when the rails were the way to travel.

We are fortunate to have as our speaker Mr. Gibson Yungblut, the local expert on the history of the terminal. His slide presentation will trace the history of CUT from the construction to the present time.

"Gib" as he is affectionately known by friends of the Cincinnati Railroad Club, is a native of Cincinnati. He was born in Cincinnati about the time Union Terminal was being completed. When in the seventh grade he was given a copy of a brochure about Union Terminal published when it opened in 1933. From that point on, the terminal and its history have been an all-consuming hobby of his. He has collected anything and everything relating to the Terminal.

Gibson recently retired from Frost & Jacobs as a corporate lawyer. He is also a trustee of the Cincinnati Railroad Club (which is now the oldest tenant in the terminal) and a past trustee of the Union Terminal Association. He is a graduate of Harvard University and the University of Cincinnati College of Law. He has coauthored several books about CUT.

Tour Highlights

Kings Island was opened in 1972 as a replacement for Coney Island that was land-locked and in the Ohio River flood plain. Taft Broadcast was the original builder. Park ownership has changed several times since then. Kings Entertainment Company (KECO), comprised of all senior management of the Park group in a leveraged buyout, purchased the park from Taft. Taft retained a minority interest in KECO. When Taft was purchased by Great American Broadcasting (GAB), a Carl Lindner company, GAB relinquished ownership in KECO and all other Amusement Park properties, in exchange for full ownership of Kings Island. Paramount purchased the assets of KECO, and also Kings Island from GAB, and renamed the park Paramount's Kings Island. Paramount was purchased by Viacom who retains ownership.

You will see behind the scenes of various departments in the Construction and Maintenance division.

Jeff Gramke, Engineering Manager has been with the park since January of 1972 starting as a construction laborer in the Landscape Department and working as a part-time surveyor in the Maintenance Department. He transferred to Maintenance as a Surveyor in 1974 and held various positions (Engineering Technician, Assistant Engineer, Project Coordinator) before promotion to Engineering Manager in 1991. His department is responsible for all planning and construction of capital projects.

Cameras will not be permitted since we will be behind the scenes.

Directions to Kings Island

From 71 North take the Western Row/Kings Island exit. Turn Right at the light (Western Row Road). Turn Left at first light (Columbia Road; a short block from interchange.) Follow Kings Island directions to VIP parking. Walk to Security Post 3# adjacent to Human Resources entrance for entry into service area. Follow pavement walkway to first intersection and turn right. You will pass by the Resale warehouse complex and Central receiving on your right. Go past stop sign and to Maintenance Office entry in single story office extension in front of Maintenance Shop building; Jeff Gramke will meet the members there and direct them to the Maintenance Conference room.
